

BETTER EXPERIENCE READING GRAPHIC NOVELS

Here's what you do to read the story using YACReader instead of Adobe's Reader.

First, create a folder on your computer that will hold your graphic novels.

C:\trac-r for instance.

Second, put one or more graphic novels (actually, any PDF file can be read by the YACReader application) into the folder.

Select one of the books and acts (each book is broken into 3 acts for portability, approximately 30 pages per act). Download the act to your graphic novel folder.

Now we get to an option for graphic novel reading that greatly improves the PDF experience.

Third, go to this link:

Pick your operating system, download and install the free version.

There will not be a desktop icon made for you.

Take a moment to properly set up the YACReader so reading is like with a book.

Start/allprograms/yacreader and SEND TO a shortcut to the program on your desktop.

Launch the application, DO NOT TRY TO OPEN A FILE just yet.

Look to the upper-right corner, click on the wrench icon (3rd from right).

Set your graphic novels path, and save it, then get out of YACReader.

Relaunch YACReader. It will now open directly to your graphic novel path.

Press the "OH" key (or click on the dropdown menu at the far left top) to open a graphic novel.

Pick the novel (for Trac-R, the book/act) you wish to read.

Switch to DOUBLE-PAGE mode (upper middle, 5th to the left).

This opens the novel to read like a book.

Use the magnifier if you need (upper middle, 4th to the left).

Use right arrow to turn page right.

Use left arrow to turn page left.

All the rest you can figure out yourself, if you want more refinements.
